This beautiful place provides a home for wildlife to thrive, so we can all enjoy getting closer to nature. It is cared for by local charity Sheffield & Rotherham Wildlife Trust and your support makes this possible. Thank you.

Nestled on the doorstep of Sheffield and the edge of the Peak District, it is made up of 181 hectares of wildlife-rich landscape, characterised by a mosaic of heathland, woodland, scrub, grassland, streams and peat-bog.

Blacka Moor forms part of the internationally important landscape of the Eastern Peak District Moors, which is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). Special features of the area include its breeding birds, upland vegetation, lower plants, invertebrates and geological features.

The reserve is home to a wide variety of wildlife including the majestic red deer, common lizard, green hairstreak butterfly and moorland birds including wheatear, stonechat, whinchat and tree pipit. The wonderful upland woodland supports a diverse bird population including spotted flycatcher, redstart and several species of warbler.

Philanthropist JG Graves gave Blacka Moor to the people of Sheffield in the 1930s. Your support helps us continue his legacy of protecting this natural space for the enjoyment of local people.
