### **METHOD STATEMENT**

Sheffield and Rotherham Wildlife Trust deliver a number of activities aimed at connecting people with nature. This may be through funded projects or through bookable events. Activities are delivered to people of all ages.

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2021 the government set out a 4 step road map to start the easing of restrictions. Each step is conditional of each step being met satisfactorily. From the 17<sup>th</sup> May we will be moving into Step 3 of the roadmap.

#### This risk assessment covers:

- wild play, environmental play, family events, out of school provision including youth provision and uniformed groups and any activity delivered through funded projects Wild at Heart, Connecting Steps, Landscape connections and Natural Neighbours.

## From 17th May (step 3) to 21st June 2021

- groups of up to 30 people will be allowed to meet Outdoors.
- Rule of 6 or two households can meet Indoors provided there is adequate space for social distancing

- Parent and child groups of UP TO 15 parents can meet Indoors (under 5's do not count within limit) or up to 30 outdoors
- Youth groups of UP TO 15 people can meet indoors (leaders and group helpers do not count within limit)
- Larger organised event capacity limits apply Indoor and outdoor non-seated events are 50% usual capacity. Outdoor seated at 25% of usual capacity

For those people who are older and/or more vulnerable additional time and instruction written or visual is required to ensure they understand clearly what is expected.

Some of our engagement involves working with individuals and groups that do not use English as a first language. This will involve working with community organisations to ensure the message is clear and using visual aids as necessary.

Use of minibus travel/coach travel cannot be arranged at this time due to restrictions around mixing households in an indoor space and will be reviewed for step 4 - 21s June.

All locations must be suitable to accommodate social distancing guidelines and activities must be delivered in line with approved numbers (see above). SRWT leader must repeat and reinforce instructions on a regular basis throughout the session

This risk assessment will be reviewed regularly to reflect any changes in government restrictions and must be used in conjunction with the following:

- 1. SRWT Covid-19 risk assessments for Outdoor Work, Staff travel and transport, Fairport yard and Office working.
- 2. SRWT Policies and procedures around Safeguarding and health and safety
- 3. Activity specific risk assessment
